The Castle School

28 students (2.33%) have an EHCP—which is a decreasing figure from last academic year. Important to also acknowledge that with applications & assessments currently in progress this figure will increase further to 35 (2.90)%. In addition, TCS is currently experiencing a significant increase in the numbers of Consultations from CYP outside of the catchment due to parental preference.

113 students have identified SEND, but with no EHCP [SEN Support] 9.38%, which is a slight increase from last academic year (7.82%).

303 students (25.15%) of the school population have Highlighted Needs that are monitored at each Interim Assessment Point/SFM, including assessments for Access Arrangements in Yr9. This is a decrease from 25.7% last academic year.

Primary need EHCP: Com & Int [35.71], Cog & Learn [32.14], SEMH [28.57%], and SEN and Phys [3.57%]

*Significant increase in CYP with SLCN and/or ASD identified as primary need.

Primary Need SEN Support: Com & Int [35%], Cognition & Learning [33%], SEMH [32%] and SEN & PHYS [10%]

*Again, a significant increase in CYP being identified with SLCN and/or ASD.

National Data:

4.3% of all students in schools in England & Wales have an EHCP, continuing a trend of increases since 2016 (4.0% in 2022).

The percentage of students with SEND, but with no EHCP [SEN Support] has increased to 13.0% from 12.6% (2022) and 12.2% (2021), continuing an increasing trend since 2016.

The most common type of need for those with an EHCP continues to be ASD, and for those with SEN Support is Speech, Language & Communication needs.
