Year 7 Curriculum Enrichment Days - 20 June/21 June 2023

We have now finalised all of the arrangements for the two Curriculum Enrichment days on Tuesday 20 June, and Wednesday 21 June 2023, details of which are attached. We have endeavoured to provide a range of activities for all students and have subsidised a number of these activities to try to keep costs to parents/carers as low as possible. These Curriculum Enrichment days offer valuable opportunities for students to experience activities not normally available in the curriculum.

We anticipate all students will take part in all activities.

In order to finance trips, we ask that parents/carers make a voluntary contribution. The school subsidises some of the costs of the enrichment activities but is finding that costs are rising. If you are able to help in the financial support of this activity, there is an option to pay an additional £5. If we do not receive enough parental donations, the trip will need to be cancelled. As the school receives a grant for students currently receiving free school meals, we do not require a contribution from these students as this can be funded from the grant; however, parental consent is still required through ClassCharts. If you have any queries on the funding of this trip, please contact the school's Finance Office.

Payment for trips can be made using the online Scopay system https://www.scopay.com/castleschool-somerset. If you are unable to pay online you can pay by cash/cheque (made payable to The Castle School) or by credit/debit card (either in person or over the phone). Confirmation of payment will be accepted as parental consent and that you are satisfied with the arrangements outlined in this letter. If you do not wish your child to participate you will need to login and give a reason why. We value your feedback and will take this into consideration in our future planning. The deadline for payment/consent is **Monday 22 May.** You can pay in instalments if it's easier to spread the cost over the next month.

Please ensure that we have your up to date emergency contact details and any relevant medical information for your child, as this information is taken from our school database.

School trips are covered by the Trust insurance policy. Please be aware that:

- a) except for visits abroad, insurance arrangements are the same as for students in educational establishments, i.e., that the Trust can only insure against the proven negligence by the Trust and/or its employees; and
- b) the Trust is a member of the RPA (Department for Education risk protection arrangement) which provides personal accident cover (see copy of the policy on the school website for details) but you may consider taking out your own personal accident cover to supplement this if appropriate.

Chepstow Castle Trip

As part of the Year 7 History course, we will be studying Medieval society and more specifically, the development of castles and fortifications. This visit will be an excellent opportunity for our students in Year 7 to experience these developments for themselves. Students will go on a tour of the castle, take part in designing strategies for defending and attacking fortifications, and be enthralled by our Medieval re-enactor, archer and fletcher.

This exciting enrichment visit will help prepare students who later opt for GCSE History for their future GCSE field visit.

We advise all students to wear home clothes and sensible shoes or trainers or they will not be allowed to walk around the castle; students need to be prepared for all weathers as the area is very exposed, ie rainproof clothing, sun cream, sun hats etc. All students will need to bring a packed lunch and a pen and pencil. They will need at least two bottles of water - no food/drink is available to buy.

We will travel to Chepstow by coach. The journey should be relatively short, lasting approximately 1 hour 15 minutes each way. We will meet at the Bridgwater and Taunton College layby (SCAT) at 8.15am ready to leave by 8.30am and return by the end of the school day, at 3pm.

At its heart is a desire to encourage ambition, confidence and thirst for life-long learning within students. It enables the children to create a direct link between what they want to achieve and what the school wants to teach them. Students will come back to the programme throughout Years 8 and 9.
