Year 7 Curriculum Enrichment Days – 22/23/24 March 2022

We have now finalised all of the arrangements for the three Curriculum Enrichment days on Tuesday 22, Wednesday 23 and Thursday 25 March 2022, details of which are attached. If you are unable to pay online you can pay by cash/cheque (made payable to The Castle School) or by credit/debit card (either in person or over the phone) but you still need to login to Scopay to give consent and confirm that you are satisfied with the arrangements outlined in this letter. If you do not wish your child to participate you will need to login and give a reason why. We value your feedback and will take this into consideration in our future planning. The deadline for payment/consent is Monday 7 March 2022. You can pay in instalments if it's easier to spread the cost over the next month.

Visit to London

We are very excited to offer all year 7s the opportunity to go to London in their first year at The Castle School. The aim of the trip is to give students the opportunity to see some of the nation's historic sights and understand the workings of our capital city.

Students will need to meet at Bridgwater and Taunton College bus stop at 7.15am for a 7.30am departure and we are not due to arrive back until 7:30pm.

Students will be able to take photos outside Buckingham Palace, Trafalgar Square, Downing Street and will eat lunch in the royal park of St James. They will take a boat trip down the Thames to see the sights of Westminster Palace and St Paul's Cathedral. Students will also have time in the National Art Gallery to see some of the most famous art work in the country.

Students will be expected to wear school uniform but they should ensure they wear trainers/comfortable shoes for walking.

Students will be expected to bring the following:

- A back pack for their belongings.
- Packed lunch (there won't be time to buy lunch)
- Comfortable shoes/trainers.
- A coat.
- A charged phone to take pictures and phone home at the end of the trip.

Weymouth Aquarium

As part of the Year 7 Science curriculum, students will be learning about ecology and the environment, looking at habitats, classification and the adaptations of different species.

The visit to Weymouth Aquarium will enable students to find out about a variety of species from around the world, their adaptations, habitats and the threats facing them. They will be provided with a booklet focusing on these areas to complete during their trip.

Students should wear full school uniform. All students will need to bring a packed lunch, drink and a pen and pencil. They may also bring a small amount of spending money to use in the shop if they wish.

We will register as normal and will travel to Weymouth by coach. The journey will be approximately 1 hour 45 minutes each way. We will depart from school at 9.00am and to make the most of the day, will return at 5.00pm.

As part of our unit on Religious Authority which looks at how scriptures are used, how communities worship together and how religions follow spiritual guidance, we are visiting places of worship in Exeter. We are visiting a mosque, the Cathedral and The Salvation Army Temple. Students will have a tour of the buildings and the worship space and complete an education booklet which will assist them in their learning of the topic.
