Year 9 Curriculum Enrichment Days - 26 June/27 June 2025

We have now finalised all the arrangements for the two Curriculum Enrichment days on Thursday 26 June and Friday 27 June 2025, details of which are attached. We have endeavoured to provide a range of activities for all students and have subsidised a number of these activities to try to keep costs to parents/carers as low as possible. These Curriculum Enrichment days offer valuable opportunities for students to experience activities not normally available in the curriculum.

We anticipate all students will take part in all activities.

The cost of the trip is £22.

In order to finance trips, we ask that parents/carers make a voluntary contribution. The school subsidises some of the costs of the enrichment activities but is finding that prices are rising. If we do not receive enough parental donations, the trips will need to be cancelled. As the school receives a grant for students currently receiving free school meals, we do not require a contribution from these students as this can be funded from the grant; however, <u>parental consent is still required</u>. If you have any queries on the funding of this trip, please contact the school's Finance Office.

Payment for trips can be made using the online MCAS system https://www.mychildatschool.com/MCAS/MCSParentLogin. If you are unable to pay online you can pay by cash or by credit/debit card (either in person or over the phone) but **you still need to give consent** to confirm that you are satisfied with the arrangements outlined in this letter.

Parents of students entitled to free school meals can still consent to their child attending this trip via MCAS as there is a non-payment option.

If you are making an online payment, <u>please use the MCAS system to give your consent</u>. If you are paying by cash/card or receive free school meals, please use the slip at the foot of this letter to give your consent and return the slip to the Finance Office/Student Reception.

The deadline for consent/payment is **Friday 6 June.**

For the expedition element of The Castle School Challenge, students will be travelling to Exmoor National Park where they will start their expedition from Simonsbath and complete a challenge walk across Exmoor to Pinkery Centre. They will need to work in small groups within tutor groups to navigate the whole tutor group to set check points under National Park and school staff supervision.

Students will need to wear clothing appropriate to changing conditions on Exmoor (which can be very different to Taunton) eg sunhat, sun cream and waterproof coat and trousers if you have them. They will need a rucksack to carry water, lunch and any spare items of clothing on the walk. Footwear suitable for rugged terrain (trainers/walking boots are perfect footwear). We would recommend wearing trousers due to the risk of ticks being present. This is an opportunity for students to explore a beautiful part of the countryside whilst developing team work, navigation skills and resilience.

Students should arrive at school at normal time and register as usual. We plan to return to school for 3:20pm (dependent on traffic).

Students need to bring/wear:

- Packed lunch and drink
- Good walking boots or sturdy trainers
- Wet weather clothing eg raincoat with a hood, trousers if possible (we will be outside all day).
- Sunhat, sun cream
- Small rucksack to carry essentials

Careers: Employer Visits

As part of the Enrichment days, we are planning visits to local businesses. The purpose of the visit is to give your child an insight into the world of work, focusing on the skills employers look for in future employees. It gives students an experience of a workplace. Where the business is mobile or home based, the employer will be coming into school.

The visit may include:

- A tour of the business
- A talk by staff
- Work shadowing
- Interviews to help look at work skills

In most cases the visits will last about 2 to 3 hours. The exact timings are different for each placement and full details will be notified to students when the final selections have been made.

The dress for the day is school uniform. Transport will be provided if the business is out of town. There is no charge for this activity, and it is expected that all students in Year 9 will take part.

Some of these placements will be more popular than others so an early response is advised as places are allocated on a first come, first served basis.

Students will be asked to make choices via a link that will shortly be sent out on ClassCharts, which will provide more information about the employer to help students choose. Selections need to be completed by Monday 2 June 2025.

RBY will be visiting on Thursday 26 June and GOM on Friday 27 June.
