Year 9 Curriculum Enrichment Days - 22/23/24 March 2022

We have now finalised all of the arrangements for the three Curriculum Enrichment days on Tuesday 22, Wednesday 23 and Thursday 24 2022, details of which are attached. We have endeavoured to provide a range of activities for all students and have subsidised a number of these activities to try to keep costs to parents/carers as low as possible. These Curriculum Enrichment days offer valuable opportunities for students to experience activities not normally available in the curriculum.

We anticipate all students will take part in all activities.

In order to finance these trips, we ask that parents/carers make a voluntary contribution. We very much hope you are able to contribute; if we do not get enough contributions we will have to cancel the trip. As the school receives a grant for students currently receiving free school meals, we do not require a contribution from these students as this can be funded from the grant; however, parental consent is still required through the online Scopay system. Payment for this trip can be made using the online Scopay system https://www.scopay.com/castleschool-somerset. Please note, you will need to tick the consent box before you can pay. If you are unable to pay online you can pay by cash/cheque (made payable to The Castle School) or by credit/debit card (either in person or over the phone) but you still need to login to Scopay to give consent and confirm that you are satisfied with the arrangements outlined in this letter. If you do not wish your child to participate you will need to login and give a reason why. We value your feedback and will take this into consideration in our future planning. The deadline for payment/consent is **Monday 7 March 2022.**

Please ensure that we have your up to date emergency contact details and any relevant medical information for your child, as this information is taken from our school database.

School trips are covered by the Trust insurance policy. Please be aware that:

- a) except for visits abroad, insurance arrangements are the same as for students in educational establishments, i.e., that the Trust can only insure against the proven negligence by the Trust and/or its employees; and
- b) the Trust is a member of the RPA (Department for Education risk protection arrangement) which provides personal accident cover (see copy of the policy on the school website for details) but you may consider taking out your own personal accident cover to supplement this if appropriate.

The South West Army Engagement team will deliver leadership, command and teamwork sessions in school. Students will need to wear PE kit (a coat or blazer can be worn if cold). Sessions will be held in classrooms and on the sports field.

PSHE

Organising teacher: Mr M Wilkins

Year 9 will have three hours of PSHE during the March enrichment days. The three lessons are rights & responsibilities, risk, assertiveness.

The learning objectives of these lessons are:

Right & responsibilities

- A basic understanding of the different rights and freedoms of British citizens
- An understanding of the basic, political, legal and human rights held by British citizens. A clear understanding of the link between rights and responsibilities
- A developed understanding of rights and responsibilities, including who they apply to, where they come from and the principles behind them.

Risk

- Why people in authority's instructions should be complied with
- What is meant by personal information and what should be kept private; the importance of telling a trusted adult if they come across something that scares them
- Reasons for following and complying with regulations and restrictions (including age restrictions); how they promote personal safety
- How to predict, assess and manage risk in different situations

Assertiveness

- The importance of being assertive
- The need for negotiation in certain situations
- How being assertive means you are not taken for granted and your views are considered.

Paul Hannaford - Guest Speaker

Year 9 will also have a talk by an outside speaker, Paul Hannaford. Paul Hannaford has won multiple awards for his workshops and talks about the dangers of addiction, drugs and alcohol as well as involvement in gangs, knife crime and county lines. Through his own experiences as a former addict of over 20 years, he conveys an incredibly powerful and hard-hitting message. Paul has visited The Castle School before and we look forward to welcoming him back.
