hope you enjoy looking through some of the achievements, trips and events that have gone on during the last academic year (2022-23). We are hugely proud of the opportunities, achievements and events that we are able to offer our students. Throughout the year we offered 389 (284 last year) clubs as part of our enrichment offer, some of which is documented in this magazine.

Over 50% of students have taken part in at least one enrichment activity every week since the start of September. In addition, the trips students have been on continue to ensure we are committed to giving our students a wide range of universal enrichment. During our six enrichment days students have experienced: Year 7 - Beauty and the Beast - Bristol Hippodrome, Weymouth Aquarium, Exeter places of worship and Chepstow Castle. Year 8 - Bristol Aerospace, Bristol/Cardiff Art Museums. Year 9 - Blackrock Outdoor Ed, Eden Project, Pinkery and Exmoor as part of The Castle Challenge. Year 10 - Shepton Mallet Prison. Year 11 - Wimbleball Lake, University of Bath. Included in those days have been PSHE lessons as well as engaging with employers and outside speakers.

We have also offered the following trips and activities: Woman in Black – London, Northcott Theatre, Discover Ability Day, Blood Brothers – Cardiff, Ice skating trips to Bristol and Clark's Village, Bristol City FC, Glastonbury Abbey - GCSE History, Temple Quay - GCSE Geography, Lyme Regis, Taunton Museum, Tate -London for GCSE Art/Photography/Textiles, Exeter Chiefs Rugby, England ladies FC – Bristol (England v Belgium), Cyberfirst Final - Swindon - February 23, Mandarin Excellence Programme trip to the University of Exeter, Coachbright Graduation also at the University of Exeter, Brewhouse Theatre – Dance, Eden Project - Year 10, Exeter University Maths trip, England v Australia ODI. Residentials:- Pinkery - Yr 7s, Cologne - December 22, New York - February 23, Sorrento April 23, Courchevel skiing April 23, Berlin, Duke of Edinburgh Bronze Award and The Ardèche and Cambodia this July/August.

There is such a vibrancy around school during the year no more so than when we have the enterprise project taking place and this epitomises that sense of belonging we all have to the school and our community. There were some significant sporting achievements this year too. Again, this success is testament to the talent and dedication of our students but also to the Health faculty and other colleagues who ensure these opportunities happen.

Forty students went on the German Christmas trip to Cologne in December and trips to China, Spain and France are planned for the next academic year. Year 9 and GCSE languages students have been supported all year by visiting native speakers from Taunton School and Queen's College.



We hosted a German Teacher programme with Frau Merschmann with us for 2 weeks, supporting students in their German lessons and this week we have hosted Chinese students and teaching colleagues. We maintain our strong links with Richard Huish College and good numbers of our students continue with a language to A level. Richard Huish staff have given assemblies and run workshops for Year 9/10 languages students and Year 11 students visited the college to take part in an A level Spanish lesson.

Following our sports day yesterday, 'O' will celebrate their House Trophy win by having Periods 4 and 5 off timetable on Tuesday 18 July; having fun on the 'sizzler', the dodgems, 'Pure Adrenaline' and the inflatables. It's all to play for next year and I look forward to the other Houses trying to knock Lancaster off top spot! We are proud to announce that 58 students achieved gold, 45 silver and 105 bronze. Well done to all the students who took part.









KESULTS

Students at The Castle School have had yet another fantastic set of results achieved by 'a superb group of young people who were highly motivated and focused, particularly considering the challenges they have faced during the pandemic and two challenging years' post COVID.' said Mr Lamb (Headteacher).

74% of students achieved a grade 4 or more in As a comprehensive school, we are proud of every both English and Maths, whilst 54% gained a grade 5 or more in English and maths. A quarter of students achieved 5 or more results in grade 7-9s. Three quarters of all grades were grade 5 and above. 86 students achieved grades 7-9 in at least 3 of their GCSEs. 44 students achieved grades 7-9 in at least 7 subjects.

78% of students achieved the equivalent old measure of at least 5 A-C grades including English and maths (now grades 9-4). A fabulous achievement by all of our students and very well deserved.

We are very proud to have some of the best teachers in the South West and our students really benefit from this. This year, students have done particularly well in: English, maths, triple science, music, drama, philosophy and languages, especially French. sport and PE always do exceptionally well and this year was no different.



This annual event, organised by the National Cyber Security Centre (NCSC) through their CyberFirst initiative, aims to encourage girls to consider a career in cyber security through fun and challenging cyber activities and team exercises.

Women represent just 22% of the cyber industry in the UK. The Girls Competition is an important initiative in addressing this imbalance by inspiring girls and raising awareness that cyber is a rewarding and accessible career.

Chris Ensor, NCSC Deputy Director for Cyber Growth, said:

'Congratulations to all the teams taking part in this year's competition – and especially to those who emerged victorious in their respective finals. The 2023 CyberFirst Girls Competition has been a great success, and I'd like to pay testament to the teachers who have inspired and supported their students throughout and also thank industry partners for their support in making this all possible. It's heartening to see so many young people engage with cyber security, and I hope that many of you will pursue a career within the industry and protect the UK from future online threats.'

Over 9000 girls entered the competition this year bringing the total number of participants since the competition began in 2017 to more than 65,000. The event was one of 13 regional finals which all took place simultaneously across the UK. The finalists, aged 12-13, worked in small teams to crack challenging cyber-related puzzles to score points for their school.

The Defence Academy proved to be a brilliant venue and the girls had lunch surrounded by tanks and planes. After a very long day of solving cyber challenges the girls came 5th overall. Well done to Heidi, Eloise, Fiona and Willow

THE CASTLE SCHOOL STUDENTS **DESIGN ALEXA SKILLS TO SUPPORT PEOPLE WITH ALZHEIMER'S**

THE CASTLE SCHOOL students named runners-up in the Alexa Young Innovator Challenge - Amazon's UK-wide AI coding contest – by designing Alexa Skills that aim to help people with Alzheimer's

Competition judges included TV presenter and STEM education advocate Carol Vorderman and computing prodigy and Stemettes founder Dr. Anne-Marie Imafidon

Students think AI can help solve mental health, environmental welfare and household budgeting in the face of the cost-of-living crisis.

School in Taunton have been named as runners-up in Amazon's inaugural Alexa Young Innovator Challenge after designing two new Alexa Skills that aim to help people with Alzheimer's. Skills are like apps for Alexa, allowing you to use voice commands to perform everyday tasks like checking the news, listening to music, or playing a game.

Kalina Djoukleva, Ellie Selby and Jared Johnn, designed Alexa Skills to help assist people with Alzheimer's. Kalina and Ellie's Skill acts as a reminder for vulnerable people to take their medication on the right day and at the right time, while Jared's Skill helps people understand and plan their week, ensuring they don't miss important events or family occasions.

Kalina, Ellie and Jared's Alexa Skills saw the local voungsters named as two of the runners-up in the national competition in the 13-14 age group. The pair won a £500 Amazon voucher for their school, while also taking home a £250 Amazon voucher each to spend personally.

Competition entries were picked by a judging panel including STEM advocate Carol Vorderman, computing prodigy Dr Anne-Marie Imafidon, YouTuber and computer science graduate Tobi Brown, and Lauren a career in STEM. Working alongside the industry to

> Speaking after her impressive performance in the UKwide competition, Kalina and Ellie said:

> "My Skill will especially benefit the elderly who suffer from dementia or Alzheimer's who might forget to take medication, which could be detrimental to their health. I created different daily routines which means depending on the day of the week, Alexa will say that there either is or isn't medication for that day, and offer other activities help support them."

> Jared added: "My Skill helps people with dementia or Alzheimer's to know what's happening on a particular day. This will allow them to see what events they have taking place, and what events they could plan, like having a relative come over. Due to the main group of people with Alzheimer's and dementia being elderly people, having information on how to spend their spare time such as if their children or grandchildren are at w ork or school through this Skill could greatly benefit them."

To enter the Alexa Young Innovator Challenge, students across the UK were invited to follow a free online learning programme with curriculum-linked lesson plans and resources, created by Amazon to support the development of AI learning in UK classrooms and STEM clubs. Computer science and AI related roles could contribute £71 billion a year to the UK economy to 2030, according to research commissioned by Amazon from Capital Economics, with demand for jobs that require computer science, AI or machine learning skills expected to increase by 40% over the next five years . In order to have enough AI talent in the UK workforce to fill these jobs, students need to experience some form of Albased learning during secondary school.

"We were blown away by the innovation and imaginative thinking that was evident in many of the entries we received for the Alexa Young Innovator Challenge," said Lauren Kisser, Technology Director at Amazon and UK Ambassador for Amazon Future Engineer. "The challenge forms part of our Amazon Future Engineer programme, designed to upskill young people in Artificial Intelligence and computer science, and inspire them to consider a career in STEM. If more young people like Kalina and Jared play an active part imagining ways AI can be used to tackle social issues in their communities. just think of the good that technology could achieve in the future."



Future Engineer, a comprehensive childhood-to-career programme. The initiative is designed to inspire, educate and enable children and young adults, particularly those from underserved and underrepresented communities, to realise their potential in computer science through free online coding programmes, teacher training opportunities, and virtual career chats. Since launching in 2019, Amazon Future Engineer has reached over 400.000 students across the UK.

Women are still significantly underrepresented in engineering and technology in higher education. UCAS data on university application and acceptance figures for the 2021 cycle highlighted that women represent just 16% and 18% of accepted applications to computer science and engineering degrees respectively. To help address underrepresentation and accelerate the rate of progress, in 2022 Amazon awarded bursaries worth up to £20,000 each to 31 women students from low-income households studying computer science or related engineering courses at UK universities.


Another fun packed year in the Performing Arts Department!


teaching choreography and song from the show. It was made extra special as the students designed roses with their Art teacher. For many students this was their first visit to a big theatre to see a musical.







The Young Carers in Schools programme helps primary and secondary schools improve outcomes for young carers and celebrates good practice through the Young Carers in Schools Award.

Headteacher James Lamb said "I am delighted that The Castle School has been awarded the Bronze Carers in School Award, I would like to thank Mrs Annette Horsley for all her hard work in supporting our young carers and achieving the award for the school. It is incredibly important to recognise and support our students who have additional responsibilities and commitments outside of school. We want them to know they are not alone and that there is help and support available."

Young carers are responsible for emotional, practical or physical care for a parent, sibling or other family member who has a physical disability, mental health issue or substance misuse issue.

The 2011 Census statistics revealed that there are just over 166,000 young carers in England, but research reveals that this is just the tip of the iceberg.

.The true figure could be closer to 800,000 young carers in England, equivalent to one in 5 secondary aged school children many of whom are unrecognised and unsupported.

Research carried out by Carers Trust and The Children's Society shows that, on average, young carers miss or cut short 48 school days a year and often have lower levels of self-confidence, mental wellbeing and significantly lower educational attainment at GCSE level, because of their caring role. Ofsted's Common Inspection Framework states that inspectors will look at how well schools support young carers. While some schools are doing this really well, others struggle and this causes real problems for young carers.

"To achieve their Bronze Award. The Castle School has demonstrated that it supports young carers in many ways, including homework clubs and drop-in sessions with a member of staff who is responsible for this vulnerable group of pupils. Vital information about how to identify young carers is made available to all school staff, and noticeboards and the school webpage let students and their families know where to go for help"
